The Underground Railroad

As descendants of escaped slaves, both Ann & Ron have delved deeply into the history of the complex and dangerous process of escaping to Canada. In a most detailed story, some of the highlights included:

- The story of slavery in Canada, particularly the discriminatory legislation that remained on Federal and Provincial books until late in the 20th century.
- The clever codes that were used to distribute secret routes and methods by:
 - Very secret messages in code that were guarded carefully.
 - Like most Spirituals and work songs, music gave clear messages, such as Follow The Drinking Gourd, i.e. the North Star.
 - Quilt Patterns: African textiles were used to display coded squares.
- Many helped, both on the way, such as the Quakers, and upon arrival in Canada. For example:

THE QUEEN'S BUSH SETTLEMENT, 1820-1867

In the early 19th century, the vast unsettled area between Waterloo County and Lake Huron was known as the "Queen's Bush." More than 1,500 free and formerly enslaved Blacks pioneered scattered farms throughout the Queen's Bush, starting circa 1820. Working together, these industrious and self-reliant settlers built churches, schools, and a strong and vibrant community life. In the 1840s, the government ordered the district surveyed, and many settlers could not afford to purchase the land they had laboured so hard to clear, and by 1850 migration out of the Queen's Bush had begun. Today African Canadians whose ancestors pioneered the Queen's Bush are represented in communities across Ontario.

Our speaker closed by reporting that Canada, in this 21st century, has come a long way in including all people as full citizens.



Professor in Curriculum and Higher Education at Toronto Metropolitan University

TOPIC: Artificial Intelligence and the Future of Mankind"

Your Correspondent could not possibly, in a paragraph or two, adequately summarize what was a brilliant, thought-provoking presentation.

Among his statements:

- The development of AI may be the opening of Pandora's Box.
- We (i.e. humans) are not rational we are emotional.
- While we know the sun shining on a mirror causes the mirror to shine we only refer to the mirror doing the shining.
- In discussing the possibility of robots:
 - o Robots only reflect the emotions of users.
 - o AI is reasoning without emotion.
 - o Descartes's "Cognito, ergo sum" may well be an essential concept as AI floods our world.

Dr. Chandross opened to this old mind a new way of thinking about what may face our civilization in the years to come.
