In a skillfully illustrated and presented talk, he outlined the rationale, progress and early results as outlined in this clip from the Rotary web site:

Water Collection for Sustainability is a project in North Eastern Uganda located on the site of the Ongutoi Health Centre. The principle is easily understood, create a rainwater collections system for drip irrigation to an orange orchard where the revenue will return to the Health Centre for free health care long term.
