Dick Furlong Introduction

Paul Wylezol gave an interesting presentation of the British navigator and explorer Captain James Cook. He related Cook's adventures of mapping in great detail the coastline of Newfoundland and the shoals and coastline of the Saint Lawrence River in the 1760's.
